

William's Health Update

Steve and Dianna Law returned from a quick visit to Russia early in November. Many prayers were answered as Steve was able to “unlock” the \$15,000 in mission funds that the bank was holding due to William's illness. That was vital to the continuance of the mission under the capable hands of Andre and Simeon while William slowly recovers. The news about William wasn't as encouraging. Steve and Dianna reported that William still isn't able to feed himself or move himself. He does move his fingers and hands involuntarily. Also, when someone speaks to him, he is able to move his eyes towards the speaker but is unable to speak at all. Sadly, when Steve and Dianna Law spoke to him, William became teary-eyed. His nurse told the couple that's the only way William can express his emotions. Speaking of the nursing care, it is excellent! It's mainly a family that takes care of him, 24 hours—7 days a week. They are Christians and are very attentive to him. They spend a good part of the day massaging and moving William so that his muscles don't completely atrophy. One of the family members knows a bit of English and is able to speak to William that way. Steve reported that the outside of the apartment building looks horrible, but Williams' apartment is very nice and the family makes sure it stays neat and clean all the time. Right now, we should consider ourselves blessed that William is in a very comfortable place while being taken care of by an excellent nurse and her family.

Since winter 2015 we have had a great joy in the Don church – a local former severe alcoholic, Nicolay by name, has been sober and attending the Don church. Nicolay has had a tough life. When he was in the Russian army back in the 90's he had to fight against Muslim rebels in the break-away Russian republic of Chechnya. He was wounded in action. When he came back to Don he started drinking heavily and married a girl who drank too. They had a son Vasily. After a few years of severe drinking Nicolay's wife died of alcoholism. The local authorities decided to take Nicolay's son away to a children's shelter. Nicolay came to his wit's end. He did not want to lose everything in his life. So, one day in the winter of 2015 he came over to Simeon's (the church house) seeking counseling and help. Simeon told him about the Way of the Lord and repentance. Soon, with God's help, Nicolay quit drinking and started attending the Don church. He fixed his home up and when Justin Allaman and Andrew Smith came last summer they helped work on Nicolay's roof. After the evident changes in his life, the authorities decided to give him his son again! Wow. Praise the Lord! Now Nicolay has a job with the local Road Maintenance Department. Recently he bought a used Russian vehicle, and he and his son Vasily have been coming to church to listen to the Word. We give God glory for this miracle in Nicolay's life.
