But it also took some significant funds to fill in all the cracks in the walls and floors to keep the cold wind out. From his last email, he isn't completely finished with that job, but getting closer. Meanwhile, the temperatures are around -25 degrees. He melts snow for his coffee and gravy packs since the house still doesn't have water. Hopefully, that changes once spring arrives.

The trip back home was a blur for William, so much to do and so many people to see in such a short time, but he certainly enjoyed every moment of it. From our new mailing list, it also seems he made lots of new friends as well. Speaking of mailing list, William is now able to receive mail at his new home in Greva. That address is as follows:

A MAN NAMED VITALY

Vitaly has spent a lot of his time behind bars in Russia—3 different times. However, this last time, he also was able to spend some time at a Christian rehab center. While there, he turned his life over to Christ. When he was released, he started hitchhiking back to his hometown Smolianka, which is about an hour's drive from Don. Along came Simeon who picked him up in the van. When Vitaly finally made it back to Smolianka, he reunited with his girlfriend Lena and his five year old daughter, Paulina. Lena grew up in a strict Russian Orthodox family, and at first she was very suspicious of Vitaly's new Christian faith. However, as she watched how Vitaly's life had changed and listened to his testimony, she came to the conclusion that he had found the right faith. So she decided to go with Vitaly to visit the church over in Don. It's there that Lena accepted Christ and Pastor Andrey reports that she is hungry to know more

CORRECTIONAL BOARDING SCHOOL CALLS FOR HELP

There is a correctional boarding school for kids in Ust-Kulom. It's not so much for the kids as it is for the parents. When a parent (or parents) demonstrate that he/she can't take care of their kids properly—usually due to alcohol & drug abuse—the kids are taken from the parents and put into a boarding school. As the school often doesn't have the funds to clothe the kids properly, especially in the winter, the school will often call our mission to see if we can help.

In an interesting sidelight, Yury's mother has visited the Don church a couple of times because she is related to Rimma, one of the new Believers in Don. However, I just marvel at this Christmas picture and wanted to share it in a way that is as large as possible. Because of your help, we have played a small part in building this beautiful church in Don. We now support three men & their families who are dedicated to spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ. That would be Pastor Andrey and Simeon (both of them are standing together at the very back of the group) and our newest member of the mission team, Pastor Alexei, who is standing to the left & is dressed in black. And I also remember how Antonena, as far as anyone knew, was the only Christian residing in Don for years & years before William and Andrey first arrived. That's Antonena standing to the right and holding the small child. I think of Susha (the young lady standing just to the right of Vitaly and Lena) and how she came to know the Lord and then through her new life, her mother Olga (she's sitting in the center and dressed in black) also came to know the Lord and also win her battle against alcoholism. She's been sober for 3 years now!). As you look at this picture, almost all of the people pictured here have endured very troubled lives similar to Olga's before turning to Christ. Yet here they stand as living testimonies of what God can do. Finally, look at all the children! Keep in mind, that it is a abysmally small percentage of people in Russia who know Christ. Pastor Andrey has described it as "an atheist nation." Yet there are sparks, small flames sprouting everywhere. Families are raising up children who will know and follow Christ!
