That meant dismantling the stove and working on the chimney—keep in mind that a source of dependable heat is easily the most important part of any dwelling in northern Russia.

CHURCH CAMP ISN'T JUST FOR AMERICAN KIDS

The ministry has worked hard at staying in touch with Vasily Nehoroshev. You may remember that Vasily lived with mother in Don up until she died from alcoholism. Vasily was about 8 years old at the time. Vasily now lives with his father who is also a severe alcoholic. However, Simeon and Andrey do their utmost to keep Vasily exposed to Christian teachings, like sending him to church camp. The same is true for Alexander Napalkov. Fortunately for Alexander, his mother is a Christian and faithfully attends the church in Don. But that doesn't mean that both Vasily and Alexander won't be exposed to the same temptations of alcohol as they get older. Keep in mind that alcoholism is rampant in northern Russian and the pressure to drink is immense. So any and all means to keep Christ in front of these two young men will hopefully pay off in the long term of their lives. At church camp, these young people are taught to

pray, to read their Bibles, and to worship along with the usual time for play and games. Both boys reported back about the positive influences of attending church camp. Alexander's mother especially noted some very positive changes in Alexander upon his return from camp. Please keep these two young men in your prayers—that the Lord will keep them, protect them, and grow them into young warriors for His cause.
